Ketersediaan indikator SDG Malaysia bertambah baik kepada 146 indikator

PUTRAJAYA, 3 DISEMBER 2021 – Pada hari ini, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) menerbitkan Laporan Indikator Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan (SDG), Malaysia, 2020 iaitu laporan ketiga Indikator SDG, Malaysia. Laporan ini mengandungi 146 indikator di peringkat nasional dan 19 indikator di peringkat daerah yang menyediakan input bagi penilaian pencapaian SDG di Malaysia pada tahun 2020. Ia juga memaparkan matlamat dan bidang yang perlu diberi perhatian dalam usaha pemulihan negara yang terkesan oleh pandemik COVID-19.

Mengulas terhadap laporan tersebut, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, “Secara keseluruhan, negara telah menunjukkan prestasi pencapaian SDG yang baik pada 2020 dengan 49 indikator (34%) merekodkan pencapaian positif. Ketersediaan indikator pula menunjukkan peningkatan kepada 59 peratus (146 indikator) pada 2020 berbanding 52 peratus (128 indikator) tahun

sebelumnya. Selebihnya 63 indikator (26%) masih perlu dibangun, 25 indikator (10%) tidak tersedia dan 13 indikator (5%) tidak relevan kepada Malaysia. Penyusunan indikator ini adalah berdasarkan statistik daripada DOSM dan dapatan survei serta rekod pentadbiran daripada 36 agensi/kementerian.”

Dalam konteks ketersediaan indikator mengikut matlamat pula, tiga matlamat yang mencapai ketersediaan indikator yang paling tinggi adalah Matlamat 4: Pendidikan Berkualiti (92%), Matlamat 9: Industri, Inovasi dan Infrastruktur (92%) dan Matlamat 3: Kesihatan yang Baik dan Kesejahteraan (89%). Manakala Matlamat yang mempunyai pencapaian terendah adalah Matlamat 11: Bandar dan Komuniti yang Mampan (29%).

Usaha berterusan telah dilaksanakan oleh DOSM untuk mengurangkan jurang data bagi indikator SDG. Di antaranya adalah pelaksanaan Survei Indikator Isi Rumah Nasional (NHIS) 2021 bermula dari September hingga November 2021 yang meliputi tambahan 22 indikator SDG. Hasil daripada Banci Penduduk dan Perumahan 2020 akan menyumbang kepada 15 lagi indikator SDG manakala lapang indikator SDG akan diliputi dalam Banci Ekonomi yang akan datang. Peningkatan ketersediaan indikator SDG ini seterusnya akan dapat membantu kerajaan dalam membuat pemantauan terhadap pencapaian Agenda 2030.

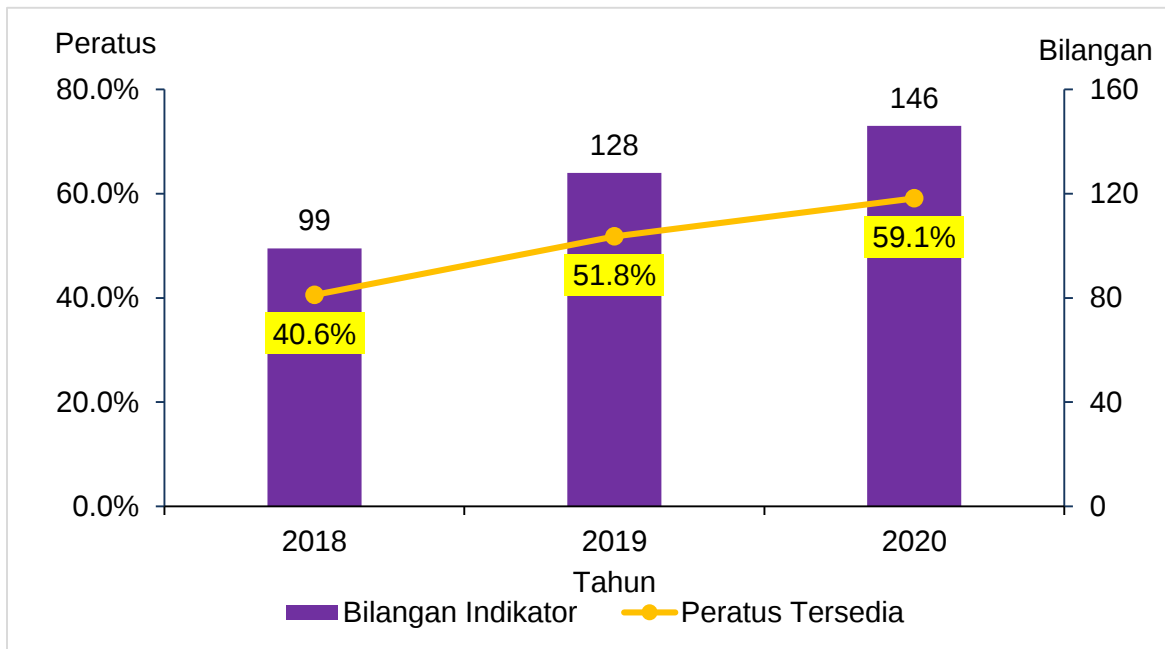
Ketua Perangkawan juga menekankan, “Kepentingan statistik di peringkat lokal membolehkan sasaran perancangan ekonomi dan pembangunan sosial di peringkat terkecil. Penerbitan My Local Stats di peringkat daerah yang diterbitkan baru-baru ini turut diujarkan kepada Matlamat SDG bagi memudahkan perancangan pembangunan yang mampan sehingga peringkat lokal. Inisiatif ini juga bertujuan untuk meningkatkan literasi SDG dalam masyarakat setempat selaras dengan prinsip *Leaving No One Behind*.”

Selain itu, dalam meningkatkan usaha pembangunan indikator SDG di peringkat lokal, DOSM telah menjalin usahasama bersama IRDA, URBANICE serta APPGM-SDG. Kerjasama dan komitmen semua kementerian dan agensi adalah amat penting dalam

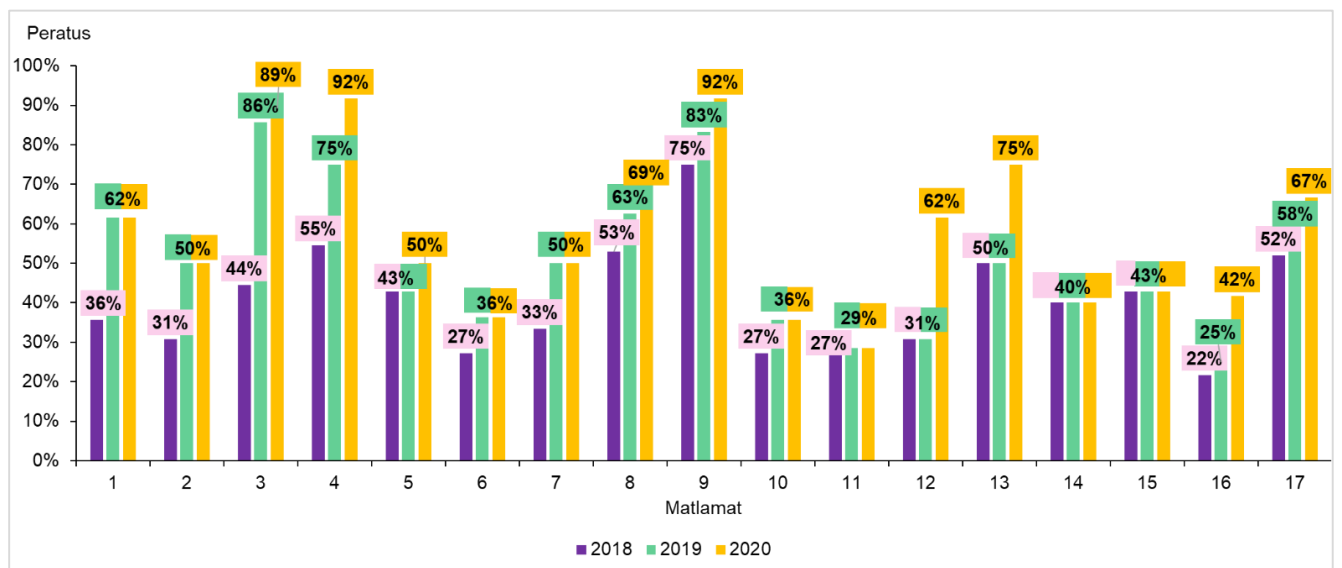
pengumpulan data bagi penyediaan indikator yang berkualiti dalam menjayakan Agenda 2030. Usaha pembangunan indikator bersama kementerian, agensi serta akademik akan terus dipergiatkan bagi meningkatkan ketersediaan data ke arah pemantauan SDG yang lebih inklusif.

SDG Indicators availability improved to 146 indicators

PUTRAJAYA, DECEMBER 3, 2021 – Today, the Department of Statistics Malaysia released the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Indicators, Malaysia, 2020 report which is the third report of SDG indicators for Malaysia. This report contains 146 indicators at national level and 19 indicators at district level which provides input for the assessment of SDGs achievement in Malaysia, 2020. It also presents the goals and areas that need attention in the national recovery efforts affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Commenting on the report, the Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "Overall, the country has shown good performance for SDGs in 2020 with 49 indicators (34%) recorded positive achievements. The availability of indicators shows an increase of 59 per cent (146 indicators) in 2020 as compared to 52 per cent (128 indicators) in the previous year. The remaining 63 indicators (26%) still need to be developed, 25 indicators (10%) are not available and 13 indicators (5%) are not relevant

to Malaysia. The compilation of the indicators is based on data from DOSM and administrative records as well as surveys outcome from 36 agencies/ministries.”

In the context of the availability of indicators by goal, the three goals that achieve the highest availability of indicators are Goal 4: Quality Education (92%), Goal 9: Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure (92%) and Goal 3: Good Health and Well-being (89%). This improvement is fully supported by the cooperation and coordination from agencies and ministries. Meanwhile, the goal with the lowest achievement is Goal 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities (29%).

Continuous effort has been undertaken by DOSM to reduce the data gaps for SDG indicators. Among the effort is conducting the National Household Indicators Survey (NHIS) 2021 in September until November 2021 which covers 22 additional SDG indicators. Outcome from the Population and Housing Census 2020 will contribute to another 15 SDGs indicators while eight SDGs indicators will be included in the upcoming Economic Census. The higher availability of SDGs indicators will facilitate the government in monitoring the achievements of 2030 Agenda.

The Chief Statistician also highlighted “The importance of statistics at the local level has enabled targeted economic planning and social development at the smallest level. My Local Stats report which has been published recently also has been aligned to the SDG Goals to facilitate sustainable development planning until local level. This initiative also aims to increase SDGs literacy in local communities in line with the principle of Leaving No One Behind.”

In addition, to enhance the efforts in developing SDGs indicators at the local level, DOSM has cooperate with IRDA, URBANICE and APPGM-SDG. The cooperation and commitment of all ministries and agencies in data collection are very important to provide quality indicators in the success of 2030 Agenda. Indicator development efforts with ministries, agencies as well as academia will continue to be intensified to increase data availability towards more inclusive SDGs monitoring.

Chart 1: Percentage of availability of SDG Indicators, Malaysia, 2018-2020

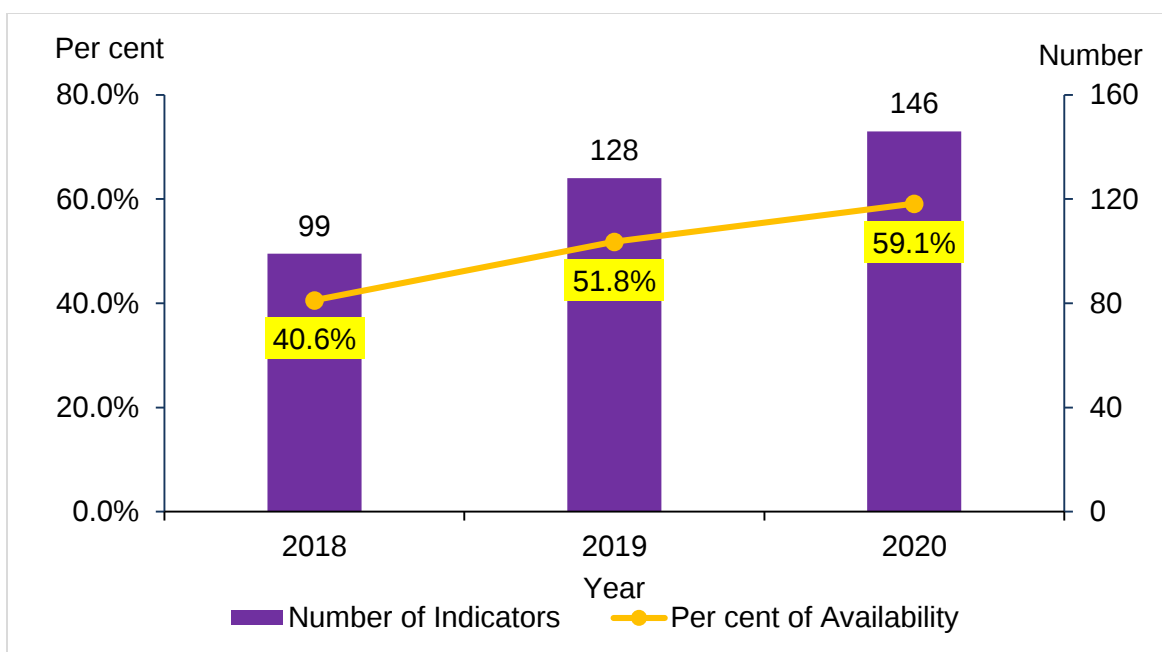
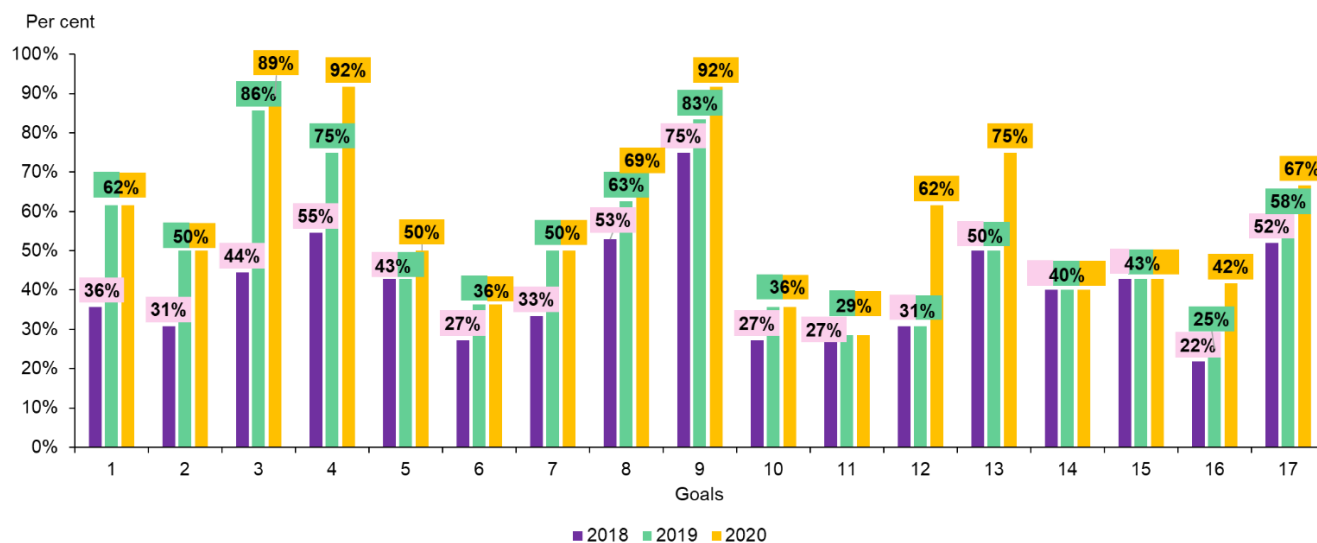


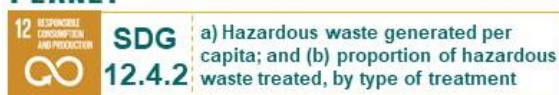
Chart 2: Percentage of availability of SDG Indicators by Goal, Malaysia, 2018-2020

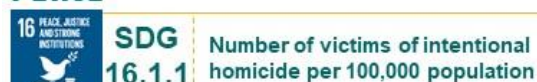


Quantity of clinical wastes handled for destruction at incinerators **escalated**

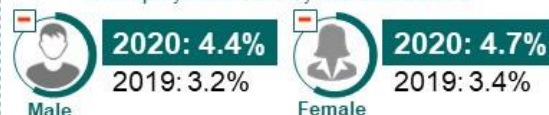
